## Answers:

- 1. \*\*Ball Rack\*\*: The area where bowling balls are placed before and after a player's turn.
- 2. \*\*Bowling Ball Weight Range\*\*: Typically between 6 and 16 pounds.
- 3. \*\*Bumpers\*\*: Metal or plastic rails that prevent balls from entering the gutters.
- 4. \*\*Foul Line Significance\*\*: Crossing this line during delivery invalidates the throw.
- 5. \*\*Perfect Game\*\*: Scoring 300 points by knocking down all pins with strikes in every frame.
- 6. \*\*Pins at Lane End\*\*: Ten pins.
- 7. \*\*Spare\*\*: Knocking down all pins within two throws in a frame.
- 8. \*\*Strike\*\*: Knocking down all ten pins with the first ball in a frame.
- 9. \*\*Action\*\*: Refers to the ball's spin, flying pins, or one-on-one bowling for money.
- 10. \*\*Address\*\*: The bowler's stance before beginning their approach.
- 11. \*\*Adjustment\*\*: Changing tactics, alignment, or equipment during the game.
- 12. \*\*Anchor\*\*: The last player to bowl in a team, typically the best player.
- 13. \*\*Approach\*\*: The way a player walks to the foul line to deliver the ball.

- 14. \*\*Area\*\*: The ability of a player to hit multiple boards and still hit the pocket.
- 15. \*\*Arm Swing\*\*: The motion of the player's arm from the first movement to the release.
- 16. \*\*Arrows\*\*: Triangles on the lane that assist bowlers in aiming.
- 17. \*\*Axis Tilt\*\*: The direction the ball's axis faces upon release.
- 18. \*\*Baby Split\*\*: Splits 2-7 or 3-10, are considered easier to pick up.
- 19. \*\*Back Ends\*\*: The lane area where players should see the most hook.
- 20. \*\*Backup Ball\*\*: A ball that moves left to right for right-handed bowlers and vice versa.
- 21. \*\*Bad Rack\*\*: Pins not adequately positioned at the lane's end.
- 22. \*\*Bagger\*\*: A series of consecutive strikes.
- 23. \*\*Baker Game or System\*\*: Team play where players contribute to one game's score in a set order.
- 24. \*\*Balance (for a ball)\*\*: Refers to the weight distribution in a bowling ball.
- 25. \*\*Ball Return\*\*: The machine that brings the ball back to the player after delivery.
- 26. \*\*Ball Track\*\*: The area where most balls roll down the lane.
- 27. \*\*Beak\*\*: The center of the headpin.
- 28. \*\*Belly the Ball\*\*: Throwing the ball wide and having it swing back into the pocket.
- 29. \*\*Big Four\*\*: The 4-6-7-10 split.
- 30. \*\*Blind Score\*\*: A placeholder score used when a team member is absent.
- 31. \*\*Blocked Lane\*\*: Lane conditions promoting high scores.
- 32. \*\*Blow\*\*: Missing a spare opportunity, not including splits.
- 33. \*\*Board\*\*: Individual slats make up the lane.
- 34. \*\*Body English\*\*: Movements by a bowler trying to guide the ball.
- 35. \*\*Boomer\*\*: A ball or player known for a big hook.
- 36. \*\*Bottom Weight\*\*: Weight distribution on the lower side of the bowling ball.
- 37. \*\*Bowl Out\*\*: Allowing a player to finish beyond their turn due to time constraints.
- 38. \*\*Break Point\*\*: Where the ball starts its hook towards the pocket.
- 39. \*\*Brooklyn\*\*: A ball that hits the opposite side of the headpin for the bowler's hand.
- 40. \*\*Bucket\*\*: A diamond-shaped cluster of pins, such as 2-4-5-8.
- 41. \*\*Carry Down\*\*: Movement of lane oil affecting ball motion.
- 42. \*\*Center of Gravity\*\*: Heaviest part of a bowling ball, often marked by the manufacturer.
- 43. \*\*Channel or Gutter\*\*: Ditches alongside the lane.
- 44. \*\*Cherry\*\*: Knocking down only the front pin(s) in a group.
- 45. \*\*Chop\*\*: Hitting only one pin in a spare setup, leaving adjacent pins.
- 46. \*\*Christmas Tree\*\*: A 3-7-10 or 2-7-10 split.
- 47. \*\*Clean Sheet or Clean Game\*\*: No open frames in a game.
- 48. \*\*Closed Pocket\*\*: When the headpin is slightly off-center from the bowler's hand side.
- 49. \*\*Conventional Grip\*\*: Fingers inserted up to the second joint in the ball.
- 50. \*\*Count\*\*: The number of pins knocked down following a spare or strike.
- 51. \*\*Bowling Variations\*\*: 5pin, 9pin, Candlepin, Bocce, Lawn, Duckpin, Feather
